## 24th November '13 Feast of Christ the King

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King marking the last week of the Church's Liturgical year. The metaphor of Christ as king is an uneasy one; power, wealth, pomp and military might are images that spring to mind when thinking of kingship. These images are in stark contrast to St Luke' Gospel readings that tells of a kingdom built on love, service, justice and peace. These principles are not always of primary value in today's society. Whose praise is sung and who is lauded the most? Not the weak or those most in need; but those in positions of privilege and power. Our challenge is to reflect the Gospel values and to make the kingdom of God more present in our community.
