#### "ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME"

This recently published encyclical of Pope Francis is acknowledged as one of the most important documents to come from the Vatican in years. The theme of the letter is caring for our world which we share in common with all other creatures. Containing almost 40,000 words, the quotes below from the document offer a small flavour of its contents.

#### Climate change .. Global warming

'Climate change represents one of the main challenges facing humanity. Its worst impact will be felt by developing countries in coming decades. This calls for changes in lifestyle, production and consumption. A new approach must also become a **social approach**, integrating questions of justice in debates so as to hear the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor.'

#### A new dialogue

'I urgently appeal for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet....the challenge, and its human roots, concern and affect us all.'

#### The Gospel of Creation

'The fact that each human being is an image of God should not make us overlook the fact that each creature has its own purpose. None is superfluous. The entire universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God. The universe, in all its relationships, shows forth the inexhaustible riches of God.'

#### **On Awe and Wonder**

'If we approach nature and the environment without openness to awe and wonder, if we no longer speak the language of fraternity and beauty in our relationship with the world, our attitude will be of masters, unable to set limits to our needs.'
