Regeneration of the former St Michael's Estate

The large attendance at the recent meeting reflected the interest and indeed the concerns of the community regarding the future of the site of the former St Michael's Estate. The meeting was organised by St Michael's Estate Regeneration Team who outlined Dublin City Council's plan for the site. The proposed plan is to construct 420 units consisting of apartments and duplexes with heights of 3-4 storey. This is to be developed in three phases; the 1st phase is the area beside Thornton Heights, (designated for older people) the 2nd phase is the 6.5 acre site of the former St Michael's Estate and the 3rd phase is the area facing Emmet Road(3.5 acres) Residents had an opportunity to give their opinions which were wide ranging. Concerns were expressed regarding the ratio of social/private/affordable units, the necessity for green space and for social and commercial amenities.
