Gospel Lk16: 19-31 'there was a rich man who used to dress in purple... and at his gate lay a poor man'

So what awful crime did the rich man commit to deserve the punishment meted out to him in this week's Gospel reading? Perhaps his only crime was that he was so distracted by his riches and possessions that he didn't even notice the poor man outside his gate.
